Sports Premium Statement September 2023

The Sports Premium is an amount of funding given by the Government in the wake of London 2012. It must be spent on **sustainable improvements** in levels of physical activity and sporting achievement.

The school has a working party consisting of staff, parents and governors. Staff, pupils and parents were surveyed, and baseline measures taken to provide a starting point in 2013 - 14.

The impact is being monitored by the local Board of Governors through annual monitoring visits.

Governors track and monitor the spending of the premium and its impact through their representation on the working party and through strategic visits to school.

In **2022 – 2023**, the school was allocated approximately £17 800. This is based on a per-school amount, topped up with a small per-pupil amount.

- New outdoor equipment purchased ensures children can benefit from outdoor learning in all weathers

Aims:

- To continue to improve children's levels of fitness in order to promote good health and long-term engagement in sport and physical activity
- To continue to promote gymnastics across the school
- To continue to improve levels of skills in throwing, catching and running
- To improve children's understanding of competitive team and individual sport
- To continue to develop teachers' expertise in teaching a broader range of PE
- To embed outdoor learning fully into the school day
