Dear Parents and Carers,

It feels as if there is a lot going on at the moment, so I thought a short update would be useful.

Interviews for the new Headteacher took place yesterday, resulting in an appointment. We are not able to give any further information at the moment, but will give further news as we are able.

After half term, we will be **no longer using Marvellous Me or Studybugs for communications from the school**. All communications will be via Arbor, so please do make sure you have signed up and downloaded the app. As we have not been able to establish absence reporting via Arbor, we will continue to use Studybugs for this alone until further notice.

Having spoken to the governors about WhatsApp communications, several parent governors have stepped forward to be the key 'lead' regarding sharing information from the school. They will be:

If anyone would be willing to do this for Year 2 and Year 5, please let the office know. There is no particular expectation connected with this role, other than to receive information from the school and then share it in the class group. This will be the same information that is sent out from the office. Hopefully this will ensure consistency and clarity of the message. Once we have these key people in place, please could we ask that other parents do not share Arbor messages with other year groups, as this has caused significant confusion in the past.

We will trial this new system across next half term and then I will send out another parent survey to collect feedback.

Parent Consultations have been moved to take place in the second week back after half term, w/b 26<sup>th</sup> February, after our first main assessments which are happening next week. Hopefully this will be the last time we use the current booking system via the office, as we are hoping to move this over to Arbor also. Teachers will send out the dates for their classes on Monday.

Lastly, and most importantly, |I have to return to the issue of driving and parking around the school at drop-off and pick-up. There is limited space around the school, as is the case with most schools, so drivers must appreciate that when planning journeys. The vast majority of our parents act responsibly and recently things have been better, but we remain in close contact with the local authority and have requested regular visits from the traffic officers. Keeping our children safe is the most important thing we do.

An out-of-hours phone line provides advice to parents and carers who are struggling with behaviours or difficulties which could be related to neurodevelopmental need, such as autism or ADHD.

Our skilled and friendly advisers will talk carers and families through ways of calming down difficult situations and remind them of their coping strategies.

It runs from 5pm until 11pm, seven days a week, 365 days a year.

#### **Regarding Penalty Notices**

Please be aware that The Education (Pupil Registration) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2013 state that Head teachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. The Head teacher should determine the number of school days a child can be away from school if leave is granted.

In accordance with the above Regulations, requests for leave of absence are treated sympathetically, but only in exceptional circumstances can they be approved. The policy of the Government to which this school has agreed, states that parents who take their child out of school for five days or more during term time, without the authority of the Head teacher, will each be liable to receive a penalty notice. Penalty Notices will be issued by the Local Authority.

The penalty is £60 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice, rising to £120 if paid after 21 days but within 28 days of receipt of the notice. If the penalty is not paid in full by the end of the 28-day period the Local Authority must prosecute the recipient for failing to ensure regular school attendance under section 444 Education Act 1996.

Please be aware that each parent is liable to receive a Penalty Notice for each child who incurs unauthorised absences, for example, if there are two parents and one child, each parent will receive one Penalty Notice.

If there are two parents and two children incurring unauthorised absences, each parent will receive two Penalty Notices, which in this case would amount to £120 each if paid within 21 days.
