

School Uniform Policy

We expect all our children to wear the correct school uniform for their Key Stage. Children not wearing the correct uniform will be asked to change into clean spare uniform for the day and a letter sent home.

Uniform is as follows: -

Nursery

- Navy jogging bottoms, leggings or shorts
- School, or plain white, or navy, polo top
- School, or v-neck, or plain, navy sweatshirt
- Plain black shoes or trainers with Velcro fastening

Reception

- Grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore
- School, or plain white, or navy, polo top
- School, or v-neck or plain, navy, sweatshirt
- Grey, navy or white socks or tights
- Plain black shoes or trainers with Velcro fastening
- Blue and white check summer dresses in warmer weather (optional)

Key Stage One (Years One and Two)

- Grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore
- School, or plain white, or navy, polo top
- School, or v-neck or plain, navy, sweatshirt
- Grey, navy or white socks or tights
- Plain black shoes or trainers
- Blue and white check summer dresses in warmer weather (optional)

Key Stage Two (Years Three to Six)

- Grey trousers, shorts, skirt or pinafore
- School, or plain white, or navy, polo top
- School, or v-neck or plain, navy, sweatshirt
- Grey, navy or white socks or tights
- Plain black shoes or trainers
- Blue and white check summer dresses in warmer weather (optional)

Where children are not able to come to school in plain black shoes or trainers, school will provide a temporary alternative, in line with this policy.

PE

- School, or plain white, or navy, t-shirt
- Black or navy shorts, or black or navy tracksuit bottoms, or leggings
- Plain black trainers, or plimsolls (at your earliest convenience, but <u>by September 2024</u>)

Uniform with the school logo can be bought online via the school website.

Outdoor learning

Comfortable outdoor clothing that can get dirty, appropriate for the time of year. Children should always have a change of clothes with them as all year groups spend a large part of the day outside. Children should also have a warm, waterproof coat to wear in cold weather, including outdoor learning, and a pair of outdoor shoes, preferably wellies, in school.

Jewellery

Watch and stud earrings only.

Surrey County Council policy is that these must be covered with tape during PE. Staff cannot provide tape or remove earrings, so please send children to school ready for their PE lesson.

Hair and Make-Up

Hair must not be excessively styled for school and long hair must be tied back with navy, subtle, sensible hair accessories for health and safety reasons.

Make-up and nail varnish must not be worn to school.

Please ensure that all children's belongings are **clearly named.** Named lost property is returned to the child. Unnamed lost property is kept in the conservatory and if unclaimed is then sold by FOBS, or recycled.
